Hi my name is Kimberly,

And this is my testimony. Ever since I was a little girl, I always went to church with my aunt. My Mom had to work on weekends so my aunt would watch me. Every Sunday I was there with her and her two kids. They were good times. I can remember the people at church would pray over me, and I would go to Sunday school. I learned a lot from my Aunt and going to church with her. Sometimes when my mom was off on Sundays me and her went to church. I was baptized back in 1987 at the Allen Temple, in Oakland, CA. This was the church that my Mother and I belonged to.

When I got in middle school that's when my life changed. I started having sex and smoking weed and cigarettes. I started ditching school; I just didn't want to go. I wanted to hang out with the crowd that came from the streets. Their parents didn't watch them or take care of them like mine did. They were on their own, and had to take care of themselves. So I started living the way they were. I started stealing from the stores and I went to jail the first time when I was 13. I was in Juvenile Hall, and my mom left me there, she was so mad at me.

As I got older and became a mother I began to stop all those crazy games I was playing. I really wanted to become a woman of God, and to be a role model for my daughter. The last time I went to jail was in 2008, and I got out in 2009. When I was locked up I began to read a book called "Vessels of Honor". I wrote Earlene Leming, the author, because I was tired of going to jail, and leaving my daughter with her dad. (Good thing he was around, I thank God for him.) . So after I wrote Earlene she sent women from Aglow out to see me. I knew that I needed help.

Before I went to jail I was the only one taking care of my Father and I knew since I was in jail that no one else would take care of him like me... He died while I was in jail. I was so hurt I needed to be around women who knew God. That's when the Women from Aglow Prison Ministry came into my life. I thank God for sending them to me. I was very close to my father but taking care of him, my daughter and myself, was just too much, and I cracked. Just like the poem in Earlene Leming's book, God took my broken "vessel" and put it back together, and I am whole today.
